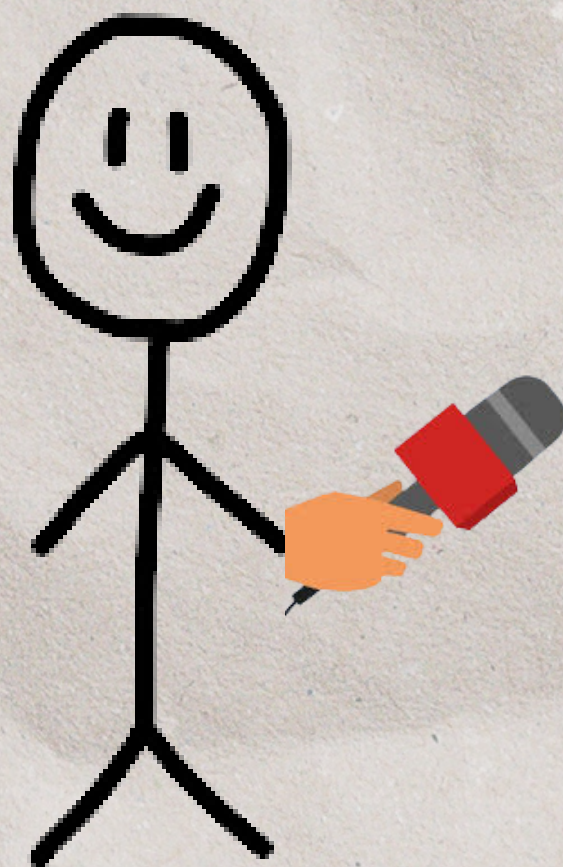

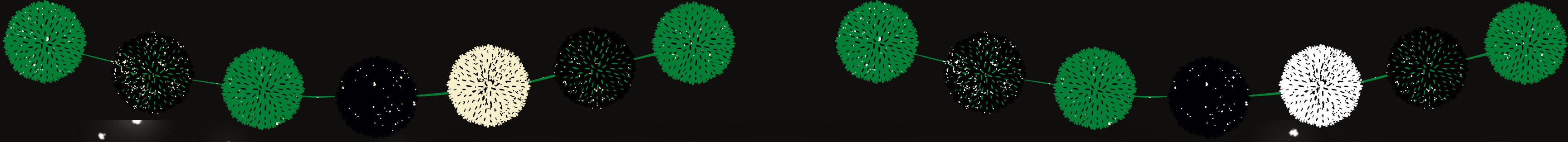
Biggs VS Redding Christian

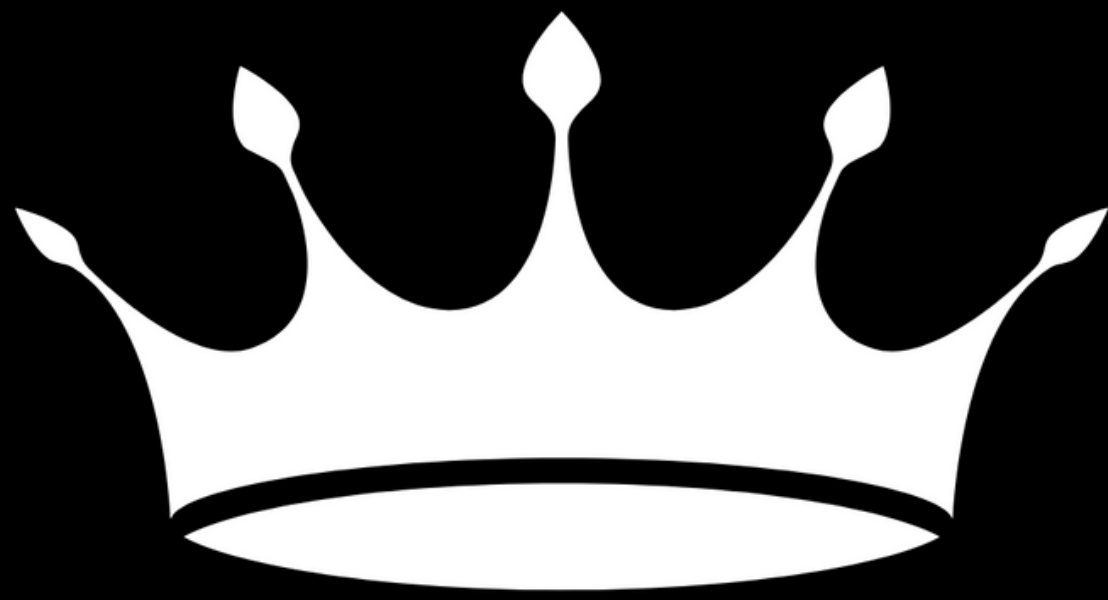
